# THE EDMUND G. “PAT” BROWN AWARD

The California Council for Environmental and Economic Balance (CCEEB), is proud to present the Edmund G. “Pat” Brown Award. Named on behalf of CCEEB’s founding chairman, the award honors an individual or organization whose activities exemplify the principles of environmental and economic balance.

## Eligibility

All individuals and organizations are eligible to receive this award, including elected officials, environmental, community, labor and business leaders, nonprofit organizations, advocacy groups, professional and trade associations, government agencies, as well as past nominees. Any individual or organization may submit one or more nominations, and may self nominate. The criteria for nominations is intended to be broad and may include anything from a lifetime of commitment to the ideals of environmental and economic balance to a specific project or endeavor.

## Selection

A selection committee will judge all nominations. The committee will consist of CCEEB directors and be representative of all three of CCEEB’s constituencies. To submit a nomination, simply mail a completed form along with any supporting materials to CCEEB at 101 Mission Street, Suite 1440, San Francisco, CA 94105 or e-mail the form to [patbrownaward@cceeb.org](mailto:patbrownaward@cceeb.org). Applications will be accepted through Thursday, May 8, 2020. Shortly thereafter, the committee will announce its final selection. 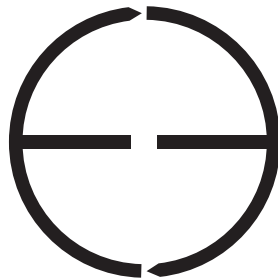
